Brokenness Is A Real Thing

Despite all of the beauty of the original creation, we cannot ignore the troubles we see all around us. The Bible deals realistically with the brokenness of the world. From the earliest moments in the Bible, we see that the origin of evil and suffering came from a decision on behalf of our ancestors. Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 made a decision that they hoped would allow them to replace the God who made them. God warned them of the consequences of such a treasonous decision, but like all of us, they ignored the warning, plunging all of us into the destructive world where sin and sorrow reign. We could complain about Adam and Eve's decision but all of us have done the same, choosing our own will against our Creator's will, often to the harm of ourselves and others around us. Notice how the Bible describes our poor choices and the brokenness that materializes out of those choices.

Broken relationships within the family

Genesis 4:3-8 "So it came about in the course of time that Cain brought an offering to the Lord of the fruit of the ground. Abel, on his part also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and for his offering; but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry and his countenance fell. Then the Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry?... If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it." Cain told Abel his brother. And it came about when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother and killed him."

Genesis 37:17-20 "So Joseph went after his brothers and found them at Dothan. When they saw him from a distance and before he came close to them, they plotted against him to put him to death. They said to one another, "Here comes this dreamer! Now then, come and let us kill him and throw him into one of the pits; and we will say, 'A wild beast devoured him.' Then let us see what will become of his dreams!"

Broken relationships between neighbors

II Samuel 11:2-3; 14-15 "Now when evening came David arose from his bed and walked around on the roof of the king's house, and he saw a woman bathing; and the woman was very beautiful. So David sent and inquired about the woman. And one said, "Is this not Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah the Hittite?"... Now in the morning David wrote a letter to Joab and sent it by the hand of Uriah. He had written in the letter, saying, 'Place Uriah in the front line of the fiercest battle and withdraw from him, so that he may be struck down and die."

Broken relationships between nations

Matthew 24:4-8; 11-12 "And Jesus answered and said to them, "See to it that no one misleads you. For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and will mislead many. You will be hearing of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not frightened, for those things must take place, but that is not yet the end. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and in various places there will be famines and earthquakes. But all these things are merely the beginning of birth pangs...Many false prophets will arise and will mislead many. Because lawlessness is increased, most people's love will grow cold."



Broken relationship with God Himself Romans 3:10-12 "There is none righteous, not even one; There is none who understands, There is none who seeks for God; All have turned aside, together they have become useless; There is none who does good. There is not even one."

The Long Shadow Cast by Our Own Heart This problem with sin and poor choices is not just the world's problem. It is our problem. All of us make choices everyday that violate the standards God has for us. All of us struggle with our own selfishness, pride, lust, anger, greed, laziness, and much, much more. Consider the following assessment from the Bible.

Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We were made to see, know and experience the glory of God but our sin creates a barrier between us and that end. The world is not as it should be, and we are the problem. Our decisions cloud the purposes for which the world was made. Our rebellion against our Creator hinders our purpose as well. Romans 3:23 says the problem is universal. All of us have sinned. All of us, each and every one of us, has failed to achieve the original intent of the creation with our lives.
