Joy, the Currency of Heaven

"His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master." Matthew 25:20

Currency exchanges always provide extra adventures for me every time I travel outside the US. Last year was no exception. On my journey to Asia, at my first stop in Myanmar, the ATM machine in the airport terminal kept my ATM card. Not only did I lose my card, but the machine didn't even give me any money from my account. My plan, as has been my practice on all previous trips, was to use that card as the source of local currency throughout my trip. For 30 minutes, I tried in vain to get my card back from that machine. Now, without access to an ATM card, three weeks of remaining travel, and no usable currency, the real struggle began. I was reduced to exchanging the few hundred dollars of US currency that I happened to have in my wallet, for the currency in the various countries I was visiting. That worked for the first week, until I ran out of money. Fortunately, my friend and traveling companion, had a functioning ATM card. He left me with some extra funds to get me through the remainder of the trip.

Travelling to heaven presents us with a similar problem. Failure to understand the currency of heaven can lead to long-term disappointment. In heaven, there will also be an exchange much like the currency exchange that takes place when travelling to another country. We will all have to exchange the currency of this life with the currency of heaven. Clearly, US \$20s will not work in heaven. The value of items in heaven is guite different than what we currently hold as valuable. Understanding this currency difference begins with an understanding of the temporary and corrupt nature of our current possessions. For instance, the US financial markets view gold as a valuable commodity. However, in heaven, gold is used as paving materials for the roads. Jesus illustrated the folly of trusting in our current, temporary resources when He told the parable of the Rich Fool. The parable of the Rich Fool can be found in Luke 12. This story recounts the foolish decision on the part of a wealthy farmer. The farmer had a bumper crop. With the excess of resources from his crop, he decided to build even bigger barns to contain all of his resources. Thinking now that his life was set for many years into the future, he discovered the folly of his dependency on the temporary resources of this life when that very night he died. God responded to the rich farmer in Luke 12:20-21 "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your soul is required of you; and now who will own what you have prepared?' So is the man who stores up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." The currency of the wealthy farmer in this life, the substantial grain in enlarged barns, was not spendable or exchangeable in heaven. He had nothing to exchange for the currency of heaven. His spiritual ATM card was lost in his ignorance of the divine currency.

In the process, he lost everything. Jesus illustrated this truth in another parable, the parable of Lazarus and the rich man. Lazarus had heavenly currency and the rich man had none. These parables illustrate the divine truth that the currency we highly value in this life does not translate to heavenly currency.

What then, in this life, can be exchanged for the currency of heaven? Good works done in the name of Christ will be exchanged for heavenly currency. Consider the words of Christ, "Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great...You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor does anyone light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven." Matthew 5:11-16. Giving, Prayer and fasting, with a dependence upon God and a humility before others, produce resources that can be exchanged for heavenly currency. Consider the words of Christ in Matthew 6: So when you give to the poor, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be honored by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full. But when you give to the poor, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving will be in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you. "When you pray, you are not to be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners so that they may be seen by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full. But you, when you pray, go into your inner room, close your door and pray to your Father who is in secret, and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you." Faith in God and a holy life produce resources that can be exchanged for heavenly currency. Consider the words of Paul in II Timothy 4:6-8. "For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith; in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved His appearing."

What then, is the currency of heaven? The currency of heaven is greater and greater levels of joy in the heart of the believer. We find this currency identified in the parable of the three investors. When the first person, the one given five talents, was evaluated by the master, he produced five more talents. He showed the Master the talents he had produced for the sake of his Master. The master responded to this servant by exchanging the ten talents, the good works and faithful life of the servant, with a good standing in the heavenly kingdom and with joy. "Enter into the joy of your Master." Joy is the currency of heaven. A life lived for the sake of Christ, the good works done in His name, provides for the believer a commodity that God will exchange. The exchange table resides at the throne of God and Christ is our exchange agent. One day every believer in Christ will stand before Him. What we bring with us to exchange in heaven will last us forever.






