"Seek Him" (excerpts from MRBC's Devotion and Prayer Book originally produced in August, 2008.)

"The LORD'S lovingkindnesses in deed never cease, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases. These are opening words of a praise song derived completely from this verse. In the midst of Jeremiah's lament over God's judgment of the nation, he is still able to declare the LORD'S lovingkindness has no limits. God's lovingkindness is boundless and knows no ends.

The parallel concept is found in the next line, "His compassions never fail." Everyday Jeremiah woke with an overwhelming sense of God's abiding love and compassion. He watched as God brought about judgment. He saw God protect him through the most treacherous moments. In the end, though heartbroken over the nation's loss, Jeremiah could look back and see that God was directing all of these things. God then came to Jeremiah with the promise of national restoration. And Jeremiah knew God would do it and he declares "Great is Your faithfulness." God carries us through our trials. Those who belong to Him, He does not abandon them. This does not mean we will never face trials. Jeremiah faced tremendous trials, but God was faithful through them all.

"You, O LORD, rule forever; Your throne is from generation to generation." Lamentations 5:19

Hope springs eternal. The throne of God, His sovereign rule over the universe, will never end. Even in the face of enormous difficulties, God cannot and will not be dethroned. No sin of humanity can thwart His plans. No rebellion in the hearts of people can weaken His power. Jeremiah stands on the hill of Jerusalem with not one stone left on top of another. And in that moment, with the throne of Israel completely toppled, he knows that the true Ruler of heaven and earth reigns. The city where once great kings, like David and Solomon, made their dwelling, now lies in ruins.

But there is a Ruler who cannot be dethroned. Imagine the comfort for Jeremiah in this. The LORD rules forever. This joyful closing to the most heart wrenching book in the bible may seem surprising. But we cannot base our hope on the events we see unfold before our eyes. We fix our hope on the One who rules the universe, both now and forever more.

"Restore us to You, O LORD, that we may be restored; Renew our days as of old." Lamentations 5:21

The restoration of a people is not dependent upon urban renewal. Restoration is not linked to the success of a nation's economy. Jeremiah does not ask God to restore the Holy City or to make the nation wealthy again. Instead, Jeremiah knows the ultimate aim and end of humanity. "Restore us to You." The restoration that Jeremiah seeks is a restoration of a relationship with God. This is the closing prayer of Jeremiah. Is this our prayer for our church? Is this the cry of our heart for our city and our nation? Does this prayer cross our lips on behalf of the nations? - "LORD, restore America to Yourself. Restore the church in America to You." As Jeremiah stood in the priestly role of pleading with God on behalf of the people, so we too are to be priests to our God on behalf of our church and nation.

Oh, God, I praise You today for Your faithfulness. God, You alone reign. You are my God and my LORD and for You alone does my heart seek. O LORD, You are our dwelling place. May we cease placing our trust in material possessions. Restore us to You. Renew our days as of old. Amen.

Shiloh Ministry




