

Fighting Boredom

"I'm bored." Just about every parent has heard these words. When I was a kid and uttered this phrase, my parents would sometimes find me something fun to do. Sometimes they gave me work around the house and I regretted vocalizing my boredom. What is the nature of boredom? What causes this intangible feeling that life is not moving fast enough or entertaining enough to satisfy? The need for visual and auditory stimulation drives much of our lives. In the car, the radio blares. In the home, the TV or gaming systems constantly pour out images and sounds. Many Americans leave the TV on even when not watching, just to have the noise in the background. Books, movies, TV, gaming, phones, theme parks, websites, and sports all provide the non-stop, friendly diversion from the mundane. There is nothing explicitly evil in any of these things. However, when the soul is unsatisfied, we run to these things like a prop. The pressing question emerges, "diversion from what?" We dread silence. We distain the dark. In the end, we are not comfortable being alone with ourselves because deep down we know that the loneliness is never being truly alone. Deep within we recognize that God Himself pierces the silence and the dark. His holy presence intimidates us. His divine power overwhelms us and we strive for the diversion from our thoughts of Him. He is both glorious and terrifying at the same time. "Our God is a consuming fire." "The mountains quake at His presence." "The whole earth trembles." At the thought of such fierce authority, we run in the other direction. Since God is omnipresent the flight takes us not to a geographical place, for "where can I go from Your presence?" Instead, our flight becomes a state of thinking, entertainment in exchange for awe, diversion in exchange for transformation. As Jacob said at Bethel, "Surely the Lord is in this place and I did not know it." God was present at Bethel just as He was always present everywhere Jacob went. God was always present. Jacob was simply distracted. God penetrated through the mundane when Jacob was finally truly alone, still long enough to see and experience

In C.S. Lewis's great work, The Weight of Glory, he described the positive impact of entertainment along with its potential harm. "The books or the music in which we thought the beauty was located will betray us if we trust them; it was not in them, it only came through them, and what came through them was longing. These things – the beauty, the memory of our own past – are good images of what we really desire; but if they are mistaken for the thing itself, they turn into dumb idols, breaking the hearts of their worshippers. For they are not the thing itself; they are only the scent of a flower we have not found, the echo of a tune we have not heard, news from a country we have never yet visited." We were made to see, know, experience and enjoy the God who made us. Sin creates an uncomfortable barrier between us and the holy creation. We drown out the uncomfortable, holy presence with noise. We destroy the foreboding silence with activity and entertainment.

The encroachment of entertainment into every facet of our life squeezes out the opportunities to contemplate that which really matters. Ironically, God is the only One who will ever satisfy our longing for true happiness. Yet each of us pushes His satisfying presence from our minds by attacking it with ideas such as "boredom," "noise," "images," and "entertainment." In the end, only God truly satisfies our souls because He is the One who has created us. Only He knows the true nature of humanity. Only He knows what will satisfy. The psalmist said it this way. "In Your presence is fullness of joy; In Your right hand there are pleasures forever." (Psalm 16:11) This article provides a gentle reminder to myself and maybe for others to be quite, to be still, to be bored, to stop long enough to allow the soul to rest in God. May we jettison boredom in exchange for His all-satisfying presence.


