

A Portrait of God: Who Is God and What Is He Like?

The Omnis: Omnipresence, Omniscience, Omnipotence, Psalm 139, Isaiah 40

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Isaiah 40:3-4 The voice of one calling out, "Clear the way for the Lord in the wilderness; Make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Let every valley be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; And let the uneven ground become a plain, and the rugged terrain a broad valley;

What is the voice supposed to call out?

Isaiah 40:5-6 Then the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all flesh will see it together; For the mouth of the Lord has spoken." A voice says, "Call out." Then he answered, "What shall I call out?" All flesh is grass, and all its loveliness is like the flower of the field.

Isaiah 40:7-8 The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; The people are indeed grass! The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever.

Isaiah 40:9 Go up on a high mountain, Zion, messenger of good news, raise your voice forcefully, Jerusalem, messenger of good news; Raise it up, do not fear. Say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"

John 1:23 He said, "I am the voice of one calling out in the wilderness, 'Make the way of the Lord straight,' as Isaiah the prophet said." John 1:34 And I myself have seen, and have testified that this is the Son of God."

Isaiah 40:10 Behold, the Lord God will come with might, with His arm ruling for Him. Behold, His compensation is with Him, and His reward before Him.

Does God care?

Isaiah 40:11 Like a shepherd He will tend His flock, in His arm He will gather the lambs and carry them in the fold of His robe; He will gently lead the nursing ewes.

Is God big enough to do anything about our situation?

Isaiah 40:12 Who has measured the waters in the hollow of His hand, and measured the heavens with a span, and calculated the dust of the earth with a measure, and weighed the mountains in a balance and the hills in a pair of scales?

Is God aware?

Isaiah 40:13-14 Who has directed the Spirit of the Lord, or as His counselor has informed Him? With whom did He consult and who gave Him understanding? And who taught Him in the path of justice and taught Him knowledge, and informed Him of the way of understanding?

Combining God's care, knowledge, and power when compared to the surrounding nations, how does our God compare?

Isaiah 40:15-17 Behold, the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are regarded as a speck of dust on the scales; Behold, He lifts up the islands like fine dust. Even Lebanon is not enough to burn, nor its animals enough for a burnt offering. All the nations are as nothing before Him, they are regarded by Him as less than nothing and meaningless.

Combining God's care, knowledge, and power when compared to the surrounding nations' so-called gods, how does our God compare?

Isaiah 40:18-20 To whom then will you liken God? Or what likeness will you compare with Him? As for the idol, a craftsman casts it, a goldsmith plates it with gold, and a silversmith fashions chains of silver. He who is too impoverished for such an offering selects a tree that does not rot; He seeks out for himself a skillful craftsman to prepare an idol that will not totter. How powerful is our God?

Isaiah 40:21-22 Do you not know? Have you not heard? Has it not been declared to you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is He who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers, who stretches out the heavens like a curtain and spreads them out like a tent to live in.

Isaiah 40:23-24 It is He who reduces rulers to nothing, who makes the judges of the earth meaningless. Scarcely have they been planted, scarcely have they been sown, scarcely has their stock taken root in the earth, but He merely blows on them, and they wither, and the storm carries them away like stubble.

Isaiah 40:25-26 "To whom then will you compare Me that I would be his equal?" says the Holy One. Raise your eyes on high and see who has created these stars, the One who brings out their multitude by number, He calls them all by name; Because of the greatness of His might and the strength of His power, not one of them is missing."

What does our God know?

Isaiah 40:27-28 Why do you say, Jacob, and you assert, Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord, and the justice due me escapes the notice of my God"? Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth does not become weary or tired. His understanding is unsearchable.

In light of the understanding of the care, power, and knowledge of God, how then should we respond?

Isaiah 40:29-31 He gives strength to the weary, and to the one who lacks might He increases power. Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, Yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.
